






Outcomes of ACES

127 high school students who were in the ACES program when they graduated from high school. Approximately another 30 students began the program during high school but dropped out before their senior year.

Of the 127, 15 are actively working in a health profession or a medically-related field.

2 are in medical residency programs.

16 are in medical/dental or other post graduate health professions programs.

49 are undergraduate students still pursuing a health profession – they may be pre-med or pre-dentistry, pre-nursing, or actually in a nursing program.

10 students took other career paths.

The status of 25 students is unknown.

Only one student did not continue to college and he is working as a dispatcher for an ambulance service.

65% success rate over 9 years taking high school students and preparing them for health careers.

Current ACES:
14 high school students who continued from last year.

23 undergraduate students currently pursuing health-related degrees.
